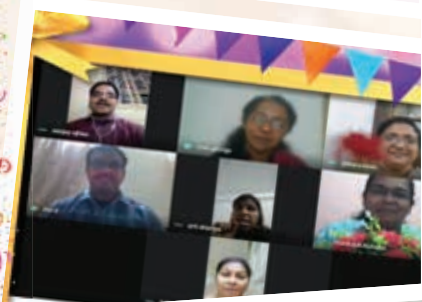

BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION:

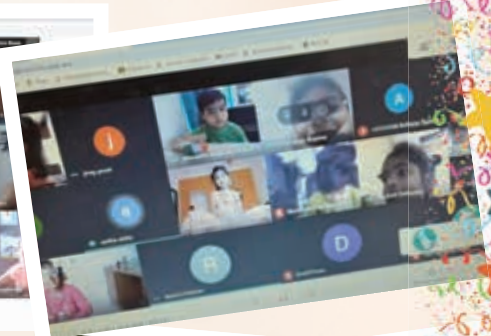

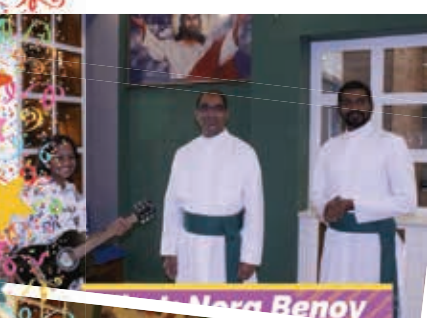

JUNIOR SECTION

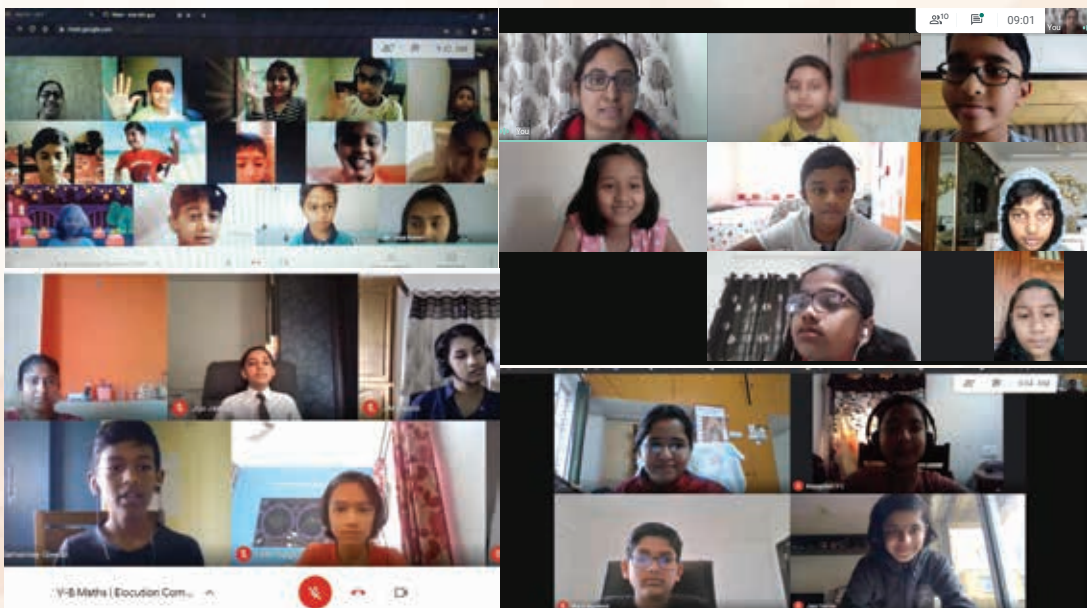

Purpose, time, health, and loved ones. These are truly the things that make us richer and make life more complete. Let's treat them accordingly.

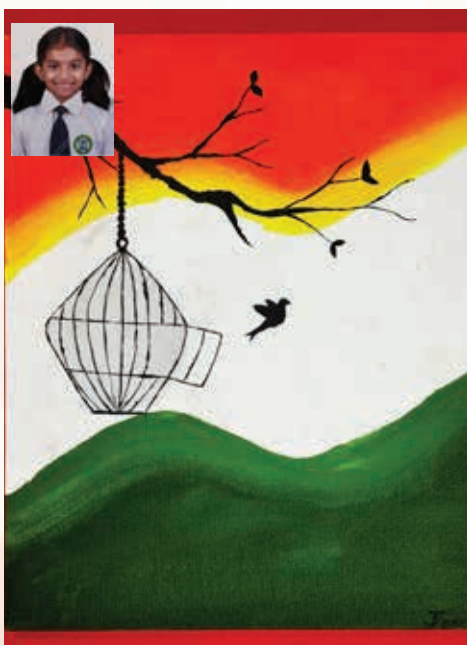
