My Visit to Guruvayur Temple

Kerala, my native place, also known as "God's own country," is very beautiful with its magnificent backwaters, unique culture and traditions. Its varied demography has made Kerala one of the most popular tourist destinations in the world.

During my exams, my Grandparents had come to stay with us and when the Dussehra holidays started, we decided to visit the Guruvayur temple. We booked a hotel close to the temple. Though we were using GPS, we lost our way. We took help of a passer-by who guided us along our way to the hotel. Due to this, we reached the hotel late and it was already dark.

We decided to have a quick bath and visit the temple in the evening. We walked barefoot from the hotel to the temple. I felt sharp stones on my foot all along, but the excitement of visiting the temple in its grandeur acted like a balm soothing the pain.

On reaching the temple, I was amazed to see serpentine queues which started from the main temple and extended to almost a kilometre. Since it was Dussehra, the number of devotees visiting the temple had increased manifold. Nevertheless, we joined the queue hoping that we will get darshan. Just as we joined the queue, some temple guards with a placard that read "End of queue" stood behind us. This was to show that the queue ends there and no more devotees should join the queue.

The queue moved very slowly and I thought we were moving at the speed of a tortoise. Once we reached the main temple area, we had a wonderful darshan of Lord Krishna. It's here, near the entrance to the sanctum of the temple that I saw a large bowl or "*ottu uruli*" full of "*Manjadikuru*" also known as Adenanthera Pavonina or Red Lucky Seed. It is believed that a devotee who places his hands in the '*uruli*' and ploughs or stirs through the seeds three times is cured of all diseases and attains prosperity. I, along with my little sister, put our hands in the bowl and stirred through the seeds.

Just as we were doing this, we saw elephants being brought near the sanctum. Everyone was asked to move and stand behind the security chains as it was time when the elephants will be taken around the sanctum for puja. One of the temple's priest climbed on top of the elephant. He had a Lord Krishna idol with him. As the elephant was taken around the temple, large number of devotees singing bhajans followed behind. I thought I was lucky to be at the main temple at the right time to witness all this.

Once we were done with the darshan, we collected the Prasadam and decided to return to our hotel as it had been a long and tiring day. But once again we lost our way in the temple as it was dark and the temple had multiple entry and exit gates. After walking around for some time, luckily we found a shop, which we had marked on our way in to the temple. From there, we found our way back to the hotel.

This was about my trip to the Guruvayur temple, which I think was both magical and adventurous.

Which **Stream** to Choose after 10th for A **Successful Career**

The very first question that pops up in your mind after 10th is "what next?" After 10th you have to take some important decisions. If you don't have an in-depth knowledge of all the career options available, you may end up choosing one which is not meant for you. A few common mistakes that student commits while making career decisions are:

- Sometimes they fail to identify the interest
- Be a part of rat race
- · Choose a career path suggested by others

LET US INDIVIDUALLY LOOK INTO STREAMS STUDENTS CAN CHOOSE:

 SCIENCE- This is the most chosen stream for 10+2 education as it offers many career options like: medicine, engineering, architecture, bio- chemistry etc. This stream is also popular because it allows the students to select commerce or arts after pursuing science in 10+2, while commerce and arts students cannot pursue science. In science stream, you have to select six subjects including one compulsory language. Options for subjects are like: mathematics, biology, physics, chemistry, computer science, electronics etc.

- **COMMERCE** This is the second most popular choice among students. Commerce stream leads to career options like- investment banking, chartered accountant, company secretaries, financial advisor, management etc. Three major subjects taught in commerce are economics, accounts and business studies /law. Like science, in commerce also students have to select six subjects including one compulsory language (Mathematics, Statistics, English and Computer Science)
- ARTS- Although this stream is not so common but it's the best for those who find science and maths difficult. It also opens exciting career options like journalism, literature, psychology, political science, philosophy, economics, archaeology, law etc. The subjects that are taught in 11th and 12th standard to Humanities /Arts students are: History, geography, political science, psychology, sociology, economics, computer science and Language (English, Hindi and Sanskrit). Students need to choose four subjects along with language.

CRITERIA FOR CHOOSING CAREER OPTIONS:

- GIVE ATTENTION TO YOUR APTITUDE, STRENGTHS AND PERSONALITY- It's time to have a reality check before you choose a stream after 10th. If you are weak in science subjects (physics/chemistry/biology /mathematics), you may have tough time facing subjects in science stream. In that case next good option will be commerce or arts. Likewise, if you are very good at economics and statistics, business studies will prove beneficial to you.
- PAY ATTENTION TO YOUR PASSION AND INTEREST 'Do what you love'. Learning something which doesn't interest you will make you feel unhappy and dissatisfied. Like- if you are interested in machines, you must take up science and after school go for courses like Engineering, B.Sc. Science. If, 9 AM to 5 PM job doesn't appeal you, probably you would like to run your own business. In that case commerce is the best stream for you. If you aim to be a lawyer or run an NGO, arts is the best option.
- HAVE A THOROUGH KNOWLEDGE OF CAREER PROSPECTS AND SCOPE RELATED TO A STREAM - Analyse each stream and check out the career prospects it holds for you. Most streams give access to diverse career opportunities. Try to understand what the future in that field will be like. Will the demand reduce in future? Is it highly vulnerable to recession?
- **TAKE ADVICE FROM EXPERTS** Suppose you aspire to be a doctor, talk to a doctor and learn about their work environment, working hours, kind of cases and patients they deal with and after this analyse if you are capable of handling the stress related to the profession.

It might seem daunting, don't hesitate to seek advice from parents, teachers and career counsellors. Don't just choose any stream because your friends are choosing the same or because others hold a high opinion about it. Try to understand your strength, weaknesses, interest and aptitude. Career decision should be taken wisely as it plays vital role in shaping your future.
